This action plan is put together by people living and working in and around Meanwood, Leeds, and is rooted in what we hear local people telling us. We recognise that we can't address all the different priorities that exist in a neighbourhood, but we do try here to identify priorities and actions that we think can achieve better together. It is a living document and constantly evolving. The category headings in pink are taken from the Council's "Best Council Plan 2020-2025" and are included as reference points for our own local priorities
